SEND Information — Understanding Autism

Autism is a developmental spectrum disability affecting how a person communicates with and relates to other people, and how they experience the world around them. Autistic people see, hear and feel the world differently to other people. Being autistic is a lifelong condition; it is not an illness or disease.

The causes of autism are still being investigated. Many experts believe that it may not have a single cause, and that genetic factors may be involved.

There is no known 'cure' for autism. All autistic people share certain difficulties, but being autistic affects them in different ways. Some also have learning disabilities, mental health issues or other conditions, meaning different levels of support are needed. However, all autistic children learn and develop, and with the right support, they can be helped to live a more fulfilling life of their choice.

As autism is a 'spectrum' condition it affects people differently, with its characteristics presenting themselves in a wide variety of combinations. As such, two people with the same diagnosis can have a very different profile of needs and skills. This makes it very difficult to generalise about how an autistic person will develop over time. In addition, an intervention that works well with one person may not be appropriate or effective with another.

Year 3/4 Learning

Orange, Purple and Pink Classes have been taking part in a project called Writing Through Art. Each week, they have explored a painting in detail, discussing the history of the artwork, the life of the artist and the details within the painting. Once they have discussed each painting, they produce a piece of written work inspired by the art they have looked at. This has included a diary entry of a man who has gone hawking for the first time, advertisements to sell the inventions of John Joseph Merlin and play scripts with new endings for Shakespeare's play Twelfth Night. To celebrate the end of the project, they visited Kenwood House for a tour of the galleries where all of the paintings that they have studied are on display.







Year 5/6 Bikeability

17 children in Years 5 and 6 have been taking part in the Level 2 Bikeability course at school this week. During the course they have been learning how to:

- Start and finish an on-road journey
- Pass parked cars or slower moving vehicles and side roads
- Make a u-turn
- Identify and react to potential hazards
- Communicate their intentions to other road users and pedestrians, as appropriate
- Use road positioning effectively
- Use junctions, including turning left and right in and out of minor roads
- Use the Highway Code and make decisions on safe riding strategy

CV Workshop

Last week some of our parents went by taxi to a company called Liberum in the City to work on their CVs. It was a very productive session with parents working with employees to create an electronic version of their CVs which they can now use to apply for jobs.
