Playtime at Pakeman

We are really excited that play is part of our School Improvement Plan this year. We want to make playtimes high quality, fun, exciting and challenging, providing children with opportunities to develop their creativity, imagination, problem-solving skills, self-esteem and resilience. We have spoken to the children about this in assembly and have appointed a working party that will meet regularly during the year to ensure that the quality of play improves.

As a school we have invested in a range of items for playtimes and would like to ask parents/carers if they have any items from the following list that we could have:

Donations of items should be brought to the school office and please only give us items that you and your children no longer need. All items will be inspected from a safety perspective before they are added to our stock of play materials for the children.

We are delighted to report that we have already seen a significant decrease in the number of playground incidents since starting this new type of playtime for the children.

We are in the process of developing a Play Policy, which we will put on our website in due course. We will also arrange to have a parents/carers meeting to discuss play. Further details will follow.
