Half-term Holiday

Art Project

We are really excited to be taking part in a very special learning project, led by the Turner prize winner and Oscarnominated director, Steve McQueen, in partnership with the Tate Gallery, Artangel and the educational charity, A New Direction. Every Year 3 class in London has been invited to take part in what will be one of the largest group portraits ever made, and to see their class photograph among thousands of others in a huge free exhibition at Tate Britain from November 2019 to May 2020. As part of this project, a Tate Britain photographer came into school on Tuesday and took a photograph of Pink class and a photograph of Purple class. Once the exhibition is over, the photographs will be given to the school.

Street Dance Trip

On Wednesday, Estelle's Street Dance Club children watched a performance by pupils at Arts and Media Islington Secondary School (AMSI). Attendance and Punctuality

For children to achieve the best possible educational outcomes it is essential for them to attend school regularly and on time. As a school we introduced Soft Start in September to ease children into the school day and this has been very successful. However, there are still some persistent cases of lateness in the mornings. It is very disruptive for children already settled in class when a child comes into the classroom late and it is also upsetting for the child who is coming in late because they feel self-conscious and have also missed out on important learning. In addition, we are also seeing increasing numbers of children being collected late at the end of the school day. We keep a record of late pick-ups and are monitoring this regularly. In cases of persistent absenteeism and lateness in the mornings and/or afternoons, parents/carers will be called into school for formal meetings regarding this matter.

2+ Centre Learning

EYFS, including the 2+ Centre, have been learning about animals from around the world - where they live and what they like eating. They have been developing their communication and language skills to enhance their vocabulary by identifying farm animals, safari animals and domestic pets, and the sounds they make. The children have enjoyed exploring a range of animals through a variety stories and rhymes in English and their home languages. They have read 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear', 'Listen, listen', 'Walking through the jungle' and 'Elmer the patchwork elephant'. They have also been exploring colours through arts and craft activities, such as making their own Elmer and friends and singing Elmer the patchwork elephant's 'Colour song' and 'I can sing a rainbow'. The children have also been developing their listening attention skills through physical games such as throwing and playing with skittles along with active songs and rhymes like 'Walking through the jungle' and 'Duck, duck goose'.

The 2+ centre have enjoyed going to the supermarket to buy food from other cultures, including noodles, prawn crackers and fortune cookies, and eating noodles with chopsticks. They also created their own lucky red envelopes and coins to share with friends for the Chinese new year celebrations.

The 2+ Centre staff would like to thank the parents who have supported them on their weekly trips to the library. Last week there were more volunteers joining them than ever before. The children loved sharing their learning experiences with their parents/carers and everyone had a great time.
