Lunch Bunch

Following last summer's Lunch Bunch pilot project, Islington Council is running a further pilot this Easter.

Lunch Bunch is a project to address holiday hunger in Islington children. It is open to children aged 6-12 years (year 1-7) who meet the national free school meals criteria, for families on benefits or low household incomes of less than £16,190 per year before tax.

Children will have the opportunity to enjoy a free, healthy lunch while spending time with their peers having fun every day throughout the school Easter holidays.
