Online Safety Workshop for Parents/ Carers

Parents/Carers are invited to join us at school on **Wed 27th March at 9am** for an online safety workshop. This is a great opportunity for you to learn about what you can do to help protect your child when they are engaging in different types of online activity. You will get lots of tips and advice to help you take effective measures to ensure they are safe.

School Council

We have a thriving school council here at Pakeman, comprised of 2 elected representatives from each of the classes. The School Council meets every half term with a member of staff to discuss school events and changes. After each meeting, the class representatives pass on any news to their classes. Pupils can talk to any of the School Council representatives at any time if they have a worry or concern about something at school, or if they have a great idea that they would like to share. Children can get in touch with their representatives in a number of ways:

- Talking to the representatives when they see them around school
- Writing a letter and giving it to one of the representatives
- Asking questions when the representatives give feedback to the classes following their half-termly meetings.

The School Council also help around the school and are involved in regular events.
