This seemingly simple story presents nuanced themes around diversity and identity for children and sparks Elmer conversations about how Elmer feels wary about looking different to his friends and stands out because he's not grey like the rest of his herd. Instead, his skin is a patchwork of bright colours. He wants to be like the rest of the elephants. So, one day he sneaks out at the crack of dawn to cover himself with the grey coloured juice of a berry he found outside the jungle. Once covered in the grey berry juice, he isn't Elmer anymore, but just another elephant.



The animals understand his conundrum of wanting to fit in and be like the rest of them, and decide to celebrate his uniqueness by instituting an annual 'Elmer's Day Parade'. To find out what happens why not listen to the Elmer story.
