It was Science Week last week. Here at Pakeman the children had great fun carrying out a range of investigations.

Years 5 and 6 investigated properties of materials. First they made a collage of the different materials they had learned about and listed their properties. Then they carried out experiments to test which materials were the best insulators, conductors of electricity and whether they were permeable or impermeable.





Years 3 and 4 performed some practical science experiments using simple materials. They used a clever technique to climb through a piece of paper, created an impossible 1-sided shape and even learned a couple of magic tricks.
