### Exciting news...


Pakeman pupils have voted for this year's School Council and the final results are in.

The fireworks looked spectacular as they lit up the night sky.




## Year 1 and 2 Hope Topic

Our work was inspired by this hero illustrated by Laura Ellen Anderson.




### **Thought For The Day**
