

It is the responsibility of parents/carers to get this check and to let the school know if there are any changes to asthma medication or the dosage your child takes.



School staff check medication is in date and if they find it out of date they will try and call you to have it replaced - but it is the responsibility of parents/carers to provide up to date medication for their children, this includes Epi pens/auto injectors and any other emergency medication.




