### **RECYCLE**

### **Definition**:

Use of the word *recycle* in a sentence:

Currently, in the UK we only recycle 4% of crisp packets and we should be trying to do more to help reduce this packaging going into landfill.



### **Empty Crisp Packets Needed**

This week, we are collecting empty crisp packets for a Crisp Packet Project. Nevaeh in year 6 is taking part in a very important recycling project, which both helps to save lives and extends the life of single use plastics. Any empty crisp packets we collect will be used to create



### bivvy bags.

Bivvy bags are made up of 150 crisp packets. These are placed on the outside of a sleeping bag to keep it dry and give more protection against cold weather. Crisp packets are an ideal material for this because they are waterproof and the silver foil lining reflects the heat and keeps a body warmer for longer. They also happen to be among the least recycled types of packaging material. Once made, bivvy bags are distributed to people living on the streets.

Please save your used crisp packets and bring them into the office all of next week.

We have until next <u>Friday</u>, 26<sup>th</sup> <u>November</u> to collect as many as possible.
