

link you can explore a 'pick and mix' of book readings to help you find new ways to love reading and new stories to share. <u>10 Minute Story Shares - World Book Day</u>


Competition - DESIGN YOUR OWN BOOK COVER

Mission To Mars - Years 5 and 6

As a finale to their Mission to Mars topic in Years 5 and 6, the children each wrote a non-fiction text explaining all about this exciting planet, which humans may one day inhabit.



Firstly, they studied other non-fiction texts, and tried to make their own texts as informative and entertaining by using a mixture of formal, scientific language and more informal language to hook in the reader. They also looked at tricks to catch the reader's attention - catchy titles and alliterative subheadings, as well as fun fact boxes full of cool information in bite-sized chunks. Finally they thought about how we could use photographs and illustrations (all with captions) to catch the reader's eye and make them want to pick up our information texts and learn all about the 'red planet'!
