Islington Poster Competition

Islington Borough is hosting a poster competition to promote active travel (this can include things such as walking, cycling, wheeling or scootering - saying why is it good to use active travel).

Pupils can use any physical medium (NOT digital) to create their design - it must be their own work.

There are PRIZES for the best KS1 and KS2 posters:

KS1 - individual prize of a scooter, pads and helmet from Micro Scooters up to the value of £350. KS1 - school prize of a 2-day scooter skills and tricks display, assembly and workshop.

KS2 - individual prize of a bike, helmet and lock from Balfe's Bikes - to the value of £650. KS2 - school prize of a 2-day BMX skills display, assembly and workshop.

There will be a lot of competition for these exciting prizes so think carefully about how to make your design stand out from the crowd.

British Science Week Poster Competition

British Science Week - March 10th - 19th

The theme this year is *Connections

Pakeman pupils are invited to enter the British Science Week poster competition.

Your poster could:

Explore how your body parts are all connected and work together

Highlight how evolution shows the ways that animals, plants and micro-organisms are all connected in a family tree stretching back millennia.

Represent the connection between people's actions and their impact on the environment.

Explore the science and technology behind the internet and how this connects people internationally at the click at a button.

Look into how atoms connect to form chemical bonds which make up everything around us, such as water.

The closing date for Pakeman entries will be Thursday 23rd March.

A panel of Pakeman judges will choose five posters to be submitted for judging by the British Science Week panel. There is an exciting list of prizes that can be won.

Posters will be judged on the following:

creativity in approach – innovative or creative interpretation of the theme content – clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic effective communication – presented and communicated in an engaging way

Entrants must be within the age categories below:

	Age	England and Wales
Early years	3-5	Nursery/Reception
Infant	5-8	Year 1 – Year 3
Junior	8-11	Year 4 – Year 6

Entrants can be teams or individuals. Entries must be one page of A4 or A3 paper only.

A team will be judged in the age category of its oldest member.

Prizes will be split across the team.

Work must be original and created by the pupils without use of any templates.

Posters must include the following information on the back:

entrant first name (all names if a team) and entrant age (all ages if a team)
 category (of the oldest team member)

Data submitted will be used for the administration of the competition. First names, ages and schools of students may also be shared on the British Science Week website and social media pages. If you do not want this data to be shared online, you should make this explicitly clear in the submission so that only the school name is shared.
