Are you on a low income or receiving certain benefits?

With the Healthy Start card, you could get up to £800 a year to buy fruit, vegetables, milk and infant formula for you and your children.

When you apply, make sure:

- Your details are up to date with HMRC or DWP
- You enter your details as they are written on your benefits award letter
- All your children under 4 are named on your Universal Credit claim

All women trying to conceive, pregnant women and young children can also get free Healthy Start vitamins from children's and health centres, no matter what their income.

Adventure Playgrounds

In Islington there are free, safe, open-access adventure playgrounds for children aged six and up. They have exciting outdoor structures and play activities in term-time, after school and during holidays. Playing outdoors can help children to develop self-confidence and social skills, as well as keep healthy. Islington adventure playgrounds are designed and built with children and young people, and supervised by trained play workers.

Adventure playgrounds are free to access for children who live or go to school in Islington. There is no booking required, but children will need to register.
