



Thank you to all those who took part in our colourful 'Pudsey' themed non-uniform day.


We raised **£131** for Children In Need.



This is an automated service available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.


- If your card isn't working in store, check that:
- you have activated your card you have entered your card into the card reader and entered your PIN before attempting to use contactless payments
- you are using the right PIN
- you have enough balance on your card to cover the transaction
- the retailer accepts Mastercard® payments
 the items you are purchasing are eligible NHS Healthy Start items

Shopping with your NHS Healthy Start card

Where to shop

You can use your NHS Healthy Start card in most places that sell milk, infant formula, fruit and vegetables and accept Mastercard®.

If you try to use your card anywhere else, the card will be declined. You cannot use your card online.

What you can buy

You can use your card to buy:

- fresh, frozen or tinned fruit and vegetables
- plain cow's milk this can be pasteurised, sterilised, long-life or ultra-heat treated (UHT)
- fresh, dried or tinned pulses
- infant formula based on cow's milk this should be suitable from birth
