


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Easy Fundraising - shopping online

Multiply

Multiply is a brand new programme designed to help adults in London improve their math skills. Capital City College is working closely with local partners to deliver Multiply at a location that's convenient for you. They run a variety of courses, including: money management, supporting you to support your children, and helping you to gain a Maths Qualification if you don't have one.

Multiply is delivered as a series of short, interactive workshops where tutors will help you and teach you how to overcome any issues mathematics presents in everyday life.

Enrolment Dates- please contact the venue for information.

To be eligible for Multiply you must:

- Have the right to live and work in the UK
- Be aged 19 or above.
- Live in London
- Not have math GCSE at grade C or above (or equivalent)
- To have resided in the UK for 3 years at least Evidence to bring;
- ID (e.g. Passport, Biometric Card or Birth Certificate) to allow us to confirm age and identity.
- Utility Bill/Bank Statement/Benefit Statement dated within the last three months to confirm your address.
 Confirmation of your immigration status (for Non-British citizens, or willingness to allow us to check your status online for those with EUSS).
