Water Aid

This week, years 3 and 4 had workshops from Water Aid, which is a charity working across the world to achieve clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene.

The children learnt that 1 in 10 people across the world do not have access to clean water and 1 in 5 do not have access to a clean inside toilet. This means that disease can spread and people cannot live the way they want to. As part of the workshop, the children had to decide how they would manage with just 10 litres of water a day like some children in Colombia - quite a challenge as we use 150 litres a day! Perhaps you can you think of ways your family could save water!

A big thank you to Bob Prothero, a volunteer from Water Aid, who came to deliver the workshops at Pakeman.



CrEATe Club

Following last week's newsletter, many of you requested more information about our CrEATe club.

CrEATe is a fusion of food, art and culture in a **weekly hub for parents/ carers and children**. It is a safe space where families can connect with one another.



Sessions take place every **Wednesdays** straight after school during term time. They are run on the school premises by the Marcia - our Family Support Worker.

The sessions will alternate between art classes and meal creations - always linked and driven by the desire to explore the cultures and art around Islington and further afield.
