We encourage all children to come to school wearing their hair in its natural style to celebrate the uniqueness and pride in Afro heritage.


During the day, we will be taking **photo portraits** of the children to mark the occasion.

All pupils must wear a Pakeman School polo shirt and a Pakeman School sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece. They must wear also wear dark grey, black or navy trousers, skirts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings.















Headscarves, if worn, must be dark grey, black or navy.



In hot weather dark grey, black or navy shorts and blue summer dresses can be worn.



Open toe footwear is NOT allowed.





Please note that for safety reasons children are not permitted to wear jewellery at school. Plain stud earrings are allowed.
