Years 1 to 4 had a fantastic time exploring the London Wetlands Centre this week.






Library Visits – Olive, Cedar and Banyan Classes

Flu Vaccine

Winter can be tough on you and your family's health. Children can get sick from the flu and pass it on easily to others. That's why the free flu vaccine is offered to all children aged 2-16.

For younger children, it's a simple, safe nasal spray instead of a needle injection. For 2-3 year-olds and eligible adults, flu vaccines are available from your GP or certain pharmacies - book via the National Booking Service (NHS website, NHS app or 119).

All children from reception to year 11 will be offered a flu vaccination at school in the autumn term – if your child misses their vaccination at school, or are homeschooled, don't worry as there are several catch-up clinics available.

Look out for the invitation and make sure to complete the consent form.
