





## Key Books



### Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Continuing to develop friendships through shared activities.
- Practising empathy and care by looking after role-play pets.
- Taking turns and sharing resources.
- Talking about their own experiences with pets or favourite animals.

### Communication & Language

- Following simple instructions in role-play and daily routines.
- Talking about pets, their needs, and what they do.
- Listening to and enjoying stories, rhymes, and songs about pets.
- Expanding vocabulary with names of pets, actions, and care routines.

### Physical Development

- Developing fine motor skills through practical activities, role-play, and using everyday tools and materials.
- Practising large movements through active games, imaginative play, and outdoor exploration.
- Developing coordination and spatial awareness during role-play, group activities, and outdoor play.
- Practising self-care routines, including handwashing, dressing, and personal hygiene.

### Literacy

- Listening to and joining in with pet-themed stories, rhymes, and songs.
- Drawing or marking pictures of pets and their accessories.
- Phonics – Continue to develop phonological awareness through Phase 1 activities.

- Learning about different pets and how to care for them.
- Role-play activities: creating pet shops, veterinary clinics, and pet care scenarios.
- Exploring real-life experiences with pets (photos, videos, or supervised visits).
