


Famous Landmarks

Marathon Facts to Inspire You (and Sabina!)

With training now well underway for Sabina we thought we'd share some marathon magic facts!

- A marathon is **42.195km**, a distance first run (legend has it) by the Greek messenger Pheidippides.
- Most runners train for **16–20 weeks**; Sabina is doing **17** - guided by an app that keeps her on track.
- The average marathoner takes **55,000–65,000 steps** on race day.
- Hydration is everything: water, electrolytes and smart fuelling make or break the final kilometres.
- Many runners do a “tune-up race” beforehand - Sabina has just run the **Battersea Half Marathon** last weekend as part of her build-up - Well done Sabina!
